## **God as Present and God as Absent**

Professor Davis' lecture is devoted to examining two contrasting conceptions of God's accessibility to the human experience—God being in the world, and God being entirely separate from the world.

A graduate of Whitworth University, Princeton Theological Seminary, and the Claremont Graduate University (PhD in philosophy), Stephen T. Davis' research concentrates on the philosophy of religion and Christian thought.

Author of over 70 academic articles and essays and the author or editor of some 15 books, Davis' recent publications include: *God, Reason, and Theistic Proofs*, *Encountering Evil: Live Options in Theodicy*, *The Redemption: An Interdisciplinary Symposium on Christ as Redeemer*, and *Christian Philosophical Theology*.
